# LIVING BYHIS THE WORD hearing and doing

If you read Mark 4:3-9, then you'll see

the 4 types of ground Jesus had mentioned:

1 The Wayside (no plans or purpose for hearing the Word)

- 2 Stony Ground (Limited stability)
- **3** Thorny Ground (No sanctification)

4 Good Ground (Able to produce good fruit)

Jesus said in **verse 9**, "he who has ears to hear, let him hear". The ground He speaks of is the heart of a person and the development of their character. The seeds of God's word must take root in the ground or the seed will remain just a seed.

When reading the parable, you soon discover the "hearing" Jesus mentions will more likely be heard through the four types of ground or "heart".

Look at **verse** 15. Satan comes immediately to three types of ground... the wayside, the stony and thorny ground who hear incorrectly. This tells us the **first** opponent to hearing properly is our self. This is what Satan will or will not be able to use to steal the word from us. What is in our heart determines the outcome of the seed.

Mark 4:4 says "when there's no plan and purpose for the seed, the birds came and devoured it." This is how Satan can use people to steal the word from us

before it can take root in our life.

Only the 4th type of ground is declared GOOD. Only the person who is able to grow is the one who hears correctly and then produces fruit.

When you plant in the ground without doing something to find out whether the seed will grow or not, it will most likely produce nothing. I was helping my son who is a landscaping contractor for a military base in our area. We were driving one day to a housing area he wanted to check out. On the way there he stopped to watch some men that were planting trees. He said to me, "those trees will all die." When I asked why, He told me that the ground they were planting in was not being prepared as it should be and every one of those trees would eventually die. When I was driving down that way approximately two months later I noticed the trees he mentioned were all dead. If seed can't take root in the ground it will never grow.

I was always puzzled by the fact that in this parable, "they heard the word" in **verse 16** "and immediately received it with gladness, but could not endure." Notice **verse 20** says good ground. They also heard also and accepted it, but they were able to produce. What was the difference between the two? The key

is found in how they received the word. In verse 16 the word received it, is the Greek word lambano. Meaning: They just happened to be at the right place, the word fell on them, and they liked what they heard. They were not purposely seeking for it. But in verse 20 the word received/accepted is the Greek word paradechomai. This tells us that they were purposely going to a specific place to hear the word and place it along side of themselves to hold close and conform to what they have heard. The reason they were able to produce fruit is because they were doing something to their ground to receive the seed

so it could take root and grow in them.

When we make a decision to not just hear, but also do the Word and take action, that's when we prepare our ground to receive the good seed of God's Word and watch it produce fruit in our lives! Praise the Lord for this understanding of the Parable of the sower in Mark chapter 4.
